



P.L.A.N.T.

Calvary Kids would like to introduce a new Bible reading program for kids. Our intention is to plant the Word of God deep into the hearts of families. This program gives direction to parents who want to teach their kids how to do a regular devotion.

The acronym P.L.A.N.T. stands for **P**repare Your Heart, **L**earn from the Word, **A**sk Questions, **N**ame the Truth, and **T**ake Action.

Each day's devotion contains an age appropriate passage, questions to ask, a truth that the kids can memorize, and a place to write down a quick prayer. The kids will also have a weekly memory verse that will help them "move-up" and earn prizes as the program continues. Each week kids can tear the point sheet out of this booklet and bring it to church on Sunday, or take a screen shot and send us a picture to keep track of their points.

At the end of the program, we will tally up all of the points and see which prize tier the kids landed on. If the child reaches the bronze tier point they will get the bronze prize. If the child reaches the silver tier, they can choose any prize in the bronze or silver tier, and so on and so forth.

Pro Tips

When: Set a regular time and place to spend some time with God.


Where: Set up a specific place in your house that is away from distractions. Make

Prepare Your Heart: During this portion of the devotional, we want the kids to take just a minute and calm their mind. This is a great time to pray. This is a time to listen and prepare their heart for what God wants to speak to them about today.

Learn from the Word: We want scripture to be hidden away in the hearts of families. Taking just a moment to read through the passages will help your kids to hide God's Word in their heart.

Ask Questions: Kids always have questions. Why this and why that. They are by nature curious and have great imaginations. So this is a great time for them to ask any questions and start a meaningful discussion

Name the Truth: Here is where we can recognize the truth that we can take away from the story. While there are many things we can take from stories, we want the kids to come away with at least one solid truth from each day's reading.

Take Action: This last portion of the day is where we will ask the kids to do something tangible. We want to make every reading practical. We want the Bible to apply directly to their life!

Prayer Journal:

Make sure at the end of every reading that your kids have some time to pray. We want them to connect with God and practice hearing His voice. This praver journal section is for your kids to write in.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Joshua sent the soldiers of Israel marching around Jericho one time a day for the next six days. The priests were to go behind the soldiers blowing seven trumpets of ram's horns before the Ark. Then, on the seventh day, everyone walked around the city seven times while the priests blew their trumpets. At the completion of this they were to make a long loud blast with their trumpets and all the people were to shout. Afterwards the walls of Jericho fell down flat!

Ask Questions

What did Joshua do in this passage? How did Joshua obey God? Why does obedience matter so much? What did God do when Joshua obeyed?

Name the Truth

Obey God, and God will do great things!

Take Action

One of the best ways to put this lesson into action is practicing obedience. If your parents have asked you to do something today, make sure that you do it right now. Let's make sure that we always obey our parents.

Prepare Your Heart

To prepare our hearts today, let's take two minutes to thank God for all the ways He has blessed you and your family!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Daniel chapter three introduces us to three young men: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. They held on to their belief in God even when threatened with a fiery death. Their story reminds us to obey God even when everything is going poorly.

Ask Questions

How did Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego obey God? What happened to them after they were thrown in the fire? Who did they put their trust in? How hot was that fire!? Who was that fourth person?

Name the Truth

When we obey God, He will protect us.

Take Action

We are going to take action today through praise! Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego praised God and stood their ground! So, find your favorite worship song and sing along at the top of your lungs!

Prayer Journal:						

Take one minute to rest, pray, and ask God to show you something new today!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: God asks Noah to build an ark because a great flood was coming over all of the Earth. God spared Noah and his family from being killed in the flood because they were faithful and true to God. Noah and his family were used to save all the animals on the Earth.

Ask Questions

How did Noah obey God? What happened to Noah and his family? What would have happened if Noah didn't obey God? Does this story make you think about how powerful God is?

Name the Truth

When we obey God, He will use us!

Take Action

Noah obeyed God by building a boat! God asked him to create something. Today's actions step: create a boat! Draw or build a boat. You can even fold a piece of paper into a boat. Put the boat beside your bed to remind you to obey God's voice!

Prepare Your Heart

To prepare our hearts today, take two minutes and pray for someone that you love. Ask God to bless them in a new way!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Adam and Eve were allowed to eat from any tree or plant in the Garden of Eden except for the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. They were deceived by the snake and made a choice to eat from the one tree they shouldn't have. They were disobedient to God.

Ask Questions

Did Adam and Eve obey God? What happened because they disobeyed God? Did God want Adam and Eve to leave the Garden of Eden? Who tricked Adam and Eve? Did Adam and Eve still have a choice to obey God?

Name the Truth

God has our best interest in mind. We should obey Him.

Take Action

Today's passage reminds us that we need to obey God. He really wants what is best for us. God wanted Adam and Eve to live in His presence (the Garden of Eden). So, for today's action we are going to spend some extra time praying. We want to be in the presence of God. So let's take some extra time and spend it with God!

Today's lesson is all about being courageous. Let's take a moment and prepare our hearts by asking God to give us courage!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: David obeyed his father and took bread and cheese to his brothers who were off at war. This obedience started David down an amazing journey. David saw that the giant, Goliath, was tormenting and taunting the Israelite army. He stood up to Goliath and won in battle.

Ask Questions

David's first action in this story was to obey his Dad! What did his dad ask him to do? If David did not obey his Dad, would he have defeated Goliath? How did God use David in this story?

Name the Truth

We obey God because He has a plan!

Take Action

David obeyed his Dad and it led to the famous story of David and Goliath. God used David to defeat the Philistine army. God took this small kid and defeated a giant! So, today we are going to do something small, but big! I want you to think of someone that needs encouraging. Then do something for them! It can be as simple as calling them, writing them a letter, or saying something nice to them in person. Do something small. It might have a BIG impact!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Jesus was walking along the beach and He saw some fishermen. They had been out all night trying to catch fish, but didn't catch any. Jesus told them to throw out their net on the other side of the boat. They were confused and tired, but obeyed. They caught so many fish their boat started sinking. Jesus asked them to follow Him after that and they did.

Ask Questions

What did Jesus tell Simon to do? I am sure the fishermen knew what they were doing, right? What happened when they obeyed? At the end of the passage, what did Simon Peter do? Why did Simon Peter follow Jesus?

Name the Truth

When we obey God, miracles can happen!

Take Action

This whole week we have been learning about stories of obedience. When we obey God, God can use us to do great things! So, for today's take action step we are going to do something special. At the end of our story today, Jesus said that Simon would be a fisher of people. We can fish for people too by inviting others to church. Can you think of someone you can invite to church? Invite them next time you see them.



BUILDING TRUST

This week, the kids will learn about stories of trust. They will learn that we need to trust God no matter what is happening!



Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Jonah was given a very important assignment from God. The people of Nineveh were in danger of being destroyed because of the wicked things they were doing! Jonah did not want to help the people of Nineveh and decided that he was going to run away from God. He boarded a ship to another land called Tarshish. God cared about the people of Nineveh and would not let Jonah run away! There were consequences to Jonah's behavior. When Jonah was thrown overboard, God sent a big fish to swallow Jonah up!

Ask Questions


What did God tell lonah to do? What did lonah decide to do instead? Did Jonah show he trusted in God? What were the consequences for Jonah's actions?

Name the Truth

Trusting in God means that we choose to go God's way, instead of our own wav.

Take Action

God is ready to forgive anyone who asks and we can be the person who helps them know how much God loves them. Today, name one person who needs to know about the love of God. Then, think of a way to share the love of God such as making a card, writing a note, or doing something special and helpful for them. Ask an adult to help you.

Prepare Your Heart

In one minute tell God as many things as you can that you are thankful for. Then ask Him to help you understand your Bible reading today.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Jonah learned his lesson when he was swallowed by the big fish! He was in the belly of the fish for three days! Can you imagine the smell? While he was there, Jonah prayed, praising and thanking God for being good to him. Jonah promised that he would tell others about God's salvation. God made the fish spit Jonah out onto the land and Jonah went straight to Nineveh! The people of Nineveh turned away from their sin and

were saved. Jonah learned that God knows what is best and to trust in Him.

Ask Questions

What did Jonah do inside the belly of the fish? What was the result? What did Jonah say to show that he trusted in God? What was God's response to Jonah's prayer? How did Jonah show that he trusted in God? What happened to the people of Nineveh? How can you show God that you trust in Him?

Name the Truth

Trusting in God means that we believe God knows what is best.

Take Action

It's hard to admit when we are wrong. Think of ways you may have gone your own way, instead of God's way. It may be disobeying your parents or teachers. Or perhaps you were mean to a sibling or classmate. Now is a good time to tell God that you are sorry and to do something to make up for it. Take some time now to pray and ask God to forgive you for choosing to make wrong choices. Then trust in God to help you share with a person you may have hurt, a way to show His love and forgiveness.

Take one minute and think about three people you love the most. Say a prayer and ask for God's blessings on them and to help you understand the Bible passage for today!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: God had a special plan for Abram. He wanted Abram to move far away to a new land and have a family that would grow into God's chosen nation to show the world who God is. Abram traveled to many different places before finding the right place God intended for him. Abram showed he trusted in God to lead him in the right direction and make the right choice for his new home.

Ask Questions

What did God tell Abram to do? How did Abram respond to God? What were the names of all the places Abram traveled to? What was God's promise to Abram? How did Abram show he trusted in God?

Name the Truth

Trusting in God helps us make good choices.

Take Action

Sometimes we are confused by things happening around us. Abram did not know where he would end up, but he trusted that God would lead him in the right direction. Today, we are going to make a compass to remind us that we can take time to worship and pray as God leads us to make the right choices. Get a paper plate or a piece of paper and draw circle on it. Mark the circle with North, South, East, West. Make an arrow out of separate paper. Attach the arrow with brads if you have them, or simply tape the arrow on the compass. Write the memory verse on the compass and decorate it. Put in a place that will remind you to spend time with God in worship and prayer. Put on your favorite song and sing out to God! When the song ends, take a minute to pray and tell God that you will trust Him to help you make good choices.

Prepare Your Heart

Take a minute and look around you. What do you see from far away? What do you see that is close to you? Say a prayer asking God to help you see what is important in today's Bible reading.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Peter was doing something he never thought he could do! He was walking on water toward Jesus! How amazing! But suddenly, Peter wasn't paying attention to Jesus. Instead, he was looking at the wind and waves. He became scared and started to sink in the water! At just that moment, he remembered that Jesus was with him. He cried out for Jesus to save him. Jesus reached out and caught Peter before he sank down into the water. Peter learned that he needed to trust in Jesus and stay focused on Him!

Ask Questions

What frightened the disciples? When they realized it was Jesus walking on the water, what did Peter do? Did Peter trust in Jesus? How did Jesus help Peter? Why did Peter sink? What should Peter have done to keep from sinking?

Name the Truth

Trusting in God means that we stay focused on Him!

Take Action

It's hard to stay focused on God sometimes especially when we worry about things happening around us. Maybe we are doing badly in school. Maybe we don't think we are good at something others are good at. Or maybe someone in our family is sick. God wants us to trust in Him and stay focused on Him no matter what is happening around us. The best way to do this is to stop and talk to God every time we worry or feel sad. So, stop right now, and tell God the things you are worried about. Tell God that you trust in Him and ask for help to stay focused on Him!

Take some time to write down the names of your closest family members. Say a prayer to God, thanking Him for each person and ask Him to help you understand the Bible reading for today.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Jairus was an important man who knew Jesus was the only one who could help his sick daughter. There was another person looking for lesus to help her, too. Jesus healed both the woman and Jairus' daughter! Even though Jairus heard that his daughter had died, he still brought Jesus home in the hopes that Jesus could help him. Jairus learned that he did not need to be afraid, but to believe in Jesus even when it seemed impossible.

Ask Questions

What was the man's name and why did he need Jesus' help? What did he do to show his trust that Jesus could help him? What happened on the way to Jairus' home? What did the woman believe lesus could do for her? Did her healing prevent lairus' daughter from being healed? How did lesus praise the woman? What did lesus say to Jairus after the news of her death was brought to him? What did lesus want lairus to know about trusting Him?

Name the Truth

Trusting in God means that we never stop believing, no matter how impossible things seem.

Take Action

God wants to help us do things that are hard! What do you need help with today? Does it seem impossible to do? Spend some extra time in prayer right now and tell God about it. Pray for those around you who need to be healed of sickness. Ask God to help you keep trusting in Him, even when things seem impossible.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Ouick Version: Mary and Martha were heartbroken when their brother died! They wanted Jesus to be there because they knew Lazarus would have been healed! It seemed as though Jesus was too late, but God had an awesome plan for Jesus to show that He has power over death. Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead! Jesus taught Mary and Martha to trust in Him to give them eternal life.

Ask Questions

What was the message to Jesus? Did Jesus immediately leave to help his friend? What terrible news came to Jesus while He was traveling to the home of Lazarus? How did Mary and Martha each show their trust in Jesus? Why did Jesus weep? What miracle did Jesus do to show that He is the Son of God?

Name the Truth

Trusting in God means that we believe in Jesus as our Savior from sin.

Take Action

Today's reading shows us that we can trust in God even when we don't think He hears us. Mary and Martha learned to trust Jesus even in the face of death. Jesus did something incredible; He brought Lazarus back from the dead. Have you decided to trust in Jesus? When we ask Jesus into our heart, we are trusting Jesus with everything! If you have never asked Jesus into your heart, tell your parents that you would like to trust in Jesus. Ask them to help you pray. If you have already trusted in Jesus, think of two people who do not know Jesus and write their names down. Put the names in your Bible to remind you to keep praying for them.

Jesus was walking around and Zacchaeus needed to climb up a tree to see Jesus because he was shorter than everyone else. Jesus looked up at the tree and told Zacchaeus that He was coming to his house to have dinner with him. Zacchaeus changed his life! He repented and gave back all the money he stole.

Ask Questions

Who was Zacchaeus? Why didn't Zacchaeus have many friends? What did Jesus say when He saw Zacchaeus? What does it mean to repent? How did Zacchaeus repent of his sins?

Name the Truth

Prayer Journal

Repentance means turning from sin and doing what is right.

Take Action

This week we are learning all about repentance. Repentance means a change of direction. So, for our take action step today, let's take the first step of repentance. The first step to repenting is listening to the Holy Spirit. Read and pray through Psalms 139:23–24.

Quick Version: Jeremiah was a prophet who was shown a vision. The vision was of a potter molding a piece of clay. God showed Jeremiah that Israel was the same as the clay. God could mold and change the clay as needed. But Israel had to repent and turn back to God for God to use them in a powerful way! Unfortunately, they didn't, but that doesn't mean that we can't repent and turn back to God!

Ask Questions

What did God have Jeremiah do? What did God show Jeremiah? Who does the clay represent? Can God reform and mold us too? What did God want Israel to do?

Name the Truth

Duay or Januarah

When we repent, God can mold us into something new!

Take Action

Jeremiah learned all about how God wants to use us in amazing ways. Our job is to let God change and mold us like clay. So for today's action step, just like God can create something, we are going to create something. You can draw something, make a quick craft, or fold a piece of paper into something new.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: There were two sons. One son stayed with the dad. The other son asked to be given his inheritance. That meant he wanted to move away. The son moved away and spent all his money. Then he was really poor. He was so poor he ate pig food. He realized he did something wrong and went back home. His father greeted him with open arms and threw him a party. The son repented and the dad forgave him.

Ask Questions

What happened to the sons? What happened to the son that went away? What was the dad's reaction to the son coming back? How do you think the son felt? How did the son repent of his sins? What happened to the other son?

Name the Truth

When we repent, God welcomes us back with open arms!

Take Action

We are learning all about what it means to repent. Even though the son in this story ran away, the dad still turned around and blessed him when he came back. For our action step today, talk with your parents about how you can bless someone else this week!

To prepare your heart and mind today, let's pray for a friend or family member who doesn't know Jesus. Pray that God would open up their hearts!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Saul was a pretty rough guy. He wanted to put all of the new Christians in jail. He was going to Damascus to arrest the Christians. Jesus stopped him on the road and told him that he was persecuting him. Saul repented and gave his life to Jesus. After that, Saul started telling everyone about Jesus!

Ask Questions

Why was Saul going to Damascus? What happened to Saul on the way? What happened to his sight? Who was Ananias? How did God use Ananias? How did Saul repent of his sins?

Name the Truth

When we repent, God can use us to reach others!

Take Action

Saul's entire life turned upside down in our reading today. After his experience Saul shared the good news of Jesus with everyone he met. So today, we want to really hide the Word of God in our heart. Take five minutes and really memorize the memory verse for this week.

Today is Friday! Let's pause and thank God for forgiving us and showing us grace and mercy.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: There was a servant who owed the king a lot of money. Like millions! The king had grace on the servant and forgave his debt. The servant then went to someone else who owed him money and put him in jail because he couldn't pay it. The servant did not show grace. The king found out! He was mad. The king put the servant in jail because he didn't show grace and mercy.

Ask Questions

What did the king do to the man who owed him money? What did the man do after he was forgiven? What should he have done? Did the man repent from his sin? What happened to the man because he didn't repent?

Name the Truth

When we repent, God will show us mercy!

Take Action

We have been learning all about repentance this week. We have been given an amazing chance to repent, but that comes through God's forgiveness. So our take action step for today is to offer someone else forgiveness. Can you think of anyone that you need to forgive? Teacher? Sibling? Friend? Family member? Talk about what happened with your parents.





Name the Truth

God helps us be strong and have a good attitude!

Take Action

If anyone should have had a bad attitude, it was Joseph. Bad things seem to happen A LOT! But Joseph had a good attitude and worked hard because of God's strength! Name some things that you have a bad attitude about doing because they are hard. Is it chores? School work? Helping with a sibling? Now name some things that you have a good attitude about. God gives us both hard and easy things that we need to do. Our attitudes should show that we trust in God to make us strong! Take Action

Like Joseph, God has a plan for your life! You may not know what He will do in years to come, but you can start doing the things to make you stronger right now. Take a moment to draw a cookie cutter outline of yourself. Now, on the outside of the picture, write down things that you do each day to take care of your physical body and be strong on the outside. Then, on the inside of the picture, write things that you need to do every day to be strong and healthy in your mind and spirit on the inside. Take a moment to pray and ask God to help you be strong on both the inside and outside.



God made it happen because Balaam would not obey Him! Balaam realized how wrong he was and how serious the consequences could have been if God had not allowed his donkey to speak. Ask Questions

Name the Truth

God is always in control!

Take Action

God knows what is best and can make the impossible happen if He needs to! When we are going our own way and do not want to go God's way, God will remind us that we should follow Him. Take some time and write down three ways you can know if God is trying to tell you something. Then, write down three people who can help you know what God's way is. If you know you are doing something that God does not want you to, talk to one of the people you have written down. Naaman did what Elisha told him to do and learned that God is the only true God who can do anything! Because of the servant girl's help, Naaman was healed and he believed in God!

Ask Questions

What did the young girl say to Naaman's wife? Why did she want to help her master? Who was the person that could help Naaman? What were the instructions given for Naaman to be healed? Why did Naaman become angry? What was the result of Naaman's obedience to Elisha's instructions? What did Naaman proclaim about God?

Name the Truth

God can use us to help others!

Take Action

God can use us to help others no matter how young we are! What are some ways you have helped others? Take some time to trace your hands on a piece of paper. Fill in one hand with all the things you can do such as walk, talk, read, carry things, smile, everything you can do! In the other hand, write down things that people need help with. 

Prepare Your Heart

Take a minute to think about the people you should obey without hesitation? Say a prayer and thank God for the people who teach you how to do the right things. Ask God to help you understand the passage for today.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Jesus called ordinary fishermen to follow Him and help others know about the Kingdom of God. These men were practically invisible to others just as Namaan's servant girl and the shepherds in the fields. Jesus knew that He needed some close friends to help Him accomplish His mission. He needed friends who would be willing to learn from Him. He knew that the men who were fishing were just the right people! They left everything right away to follow Jesus! These men would be the first of Jesus'

disciples. He would call them His friends and teach them all about God's Kingdom and how He would one day be the Savior of the world.

Ask Questions

Who were the first two people Jesus called to follow Him? What were they doing when Jesus came to them? What did they do when Jesus asked them to follow Him? Who else did Jesus tell to follow Him? What did Jesus start doing after He called His first disciples?

Name the Truth

God wants us to follow Jesus.

Take Action

The disciples Jesus called were not rich, they were not famous, they did not even have a proper education. Jesus knew they were the right people to listen to everything He would teach them. You are called to be Jesus' follower, too. Take a minute to pray and think about whether or not you are truly following Jesus. What do you need to do to follow Him? What do you need to do in order to show others you are following Him? Write down what you plan to do this week to show others you are a follower of Jesus. Pray and ask God to help you.

Take a minute and think about the things you do that shows you trust in God. Say a prayer and ask God to help you understand the Bible reading today.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Philip was so excited about meeting Jesus that he wanted his friend to meet him, too! Jesus knew how much Nathaniel loved God before He even met him! Nathaniel was amazed that Jesus knew what was truly in his heart and proclaimed that Jesus is the Son of God. Nathaniel and Philip followed Jesus and joined Peter, Andrew, James, and John as Jesus' closest friends and disciples.

Ask Questions

What are the names of the two disciples Jesus called in this passage? What did Philip do in response to Jesus' request to follow Him? What did Jesus say about Nathaniel? How did Jesus know what Nathaniel was doing? Did they follow Jesus?

Name the Truth

God knows what is in our hearts.

Take Action

Find a piece of paper and draw a big heart that fills the entire paper. Pretend this is your heart, not your real heart, but your thoughts, feelings, and the things you believe. Write them all down, both good and bad, inside the heart. Then, say a prayer asking God to forgive you of the bad things inside the heart. Cross those things out. Take time to pray and thank God for all the good things and to help you follow Jesus and do what is right.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Jesus chose twelve people to be His best friends and disciples. They were the most unlikely people from the outside, but God knew their hearts and how they would be able to bring the message of God's love and forgiveness to the world. The disciples followed Jesus everywhere He went. They saw many miracles and listened as Jesus taught about the Kingdom of God. They saw Jesus as He died on the cross, was buried, and when He rose again. They knew Jesus had a special mission for them to teach the good news to the whole world. That's a big mission! They would need help! Jesus had their backs, and told them to wait for the Helper, who is the Holy Spirit, to come. And He did! With wind and fire, the Holy Spirit filled the disciples so they knew the exact words to say for others to hear about Jesus

Ask Questions

What did the disciples see and hear while they were together in one place? Who came to the disciples and what did He look like? What remarkable ability did the disciples receive? What did the crowd do and say when they saw the disciples? What did Peter tell the onlookers about Jesus?

Name the Truth

God the Holy Spirit is our helper.

Take Action

The disciples changed when the Holy Spirit arrived and could do things they never could before! Let's take some time now to dream big. If you could go anywhere and tell others about Jesus, where would you want to go? If you could do anything that would help others learn about Jesus, what would you do? What special talent do you wish you had? Draw a picture or write down your dreams, then spend time praying and asking God to help you do the things that you dream of doing. In fact, He can help you become the person you dream of being so others can learn about Jesus, too.

Take Action

The magi came to give baby Jesus gifts. Are there any gifts that you can bring to Jesus? Not like your toys or anything like that, your talents. Write down three things that you are really good at! Can you give God your talents? Can you ask Him to use your talents to give God glory? Let's do that now!

Quick Version: The disciples and Jesus were on a boat. There was a huge storm that came and scared all of the disciples. They thought they were going to die. Jesus was sleeping. They woke Jesus up. Jesus spoke to the wind and waves and told them to be still. The storm ended immediately. The disciples were amazed at Jesus' power.

Ask Questions

What happened to the disciples? Where was Jesus? How would you feel if you were in that storm? What did Jesus do?

Name the Truth

God is more powerful than the storms of life.

Take Action

So sometimes life can seem like we are caught in a storm. We need to be like the disciples and ask for help. So, let's practice asking for help! Ask your parents to help you out with something.

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Don't forget that God deserves all the glory. Take the next two minutes and thank Him for everything that He has done for you this week!

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Daniel was a well–known and respected administrator for King Darius. Daniel prayed to God three times every single day. He even prayed when there was a law that prohibited people from praying. Daniel trusted in God. The punishment for Daniel disobeying the law was to be thrown in a lions' den. God showed His power by closing the mouths of the lions and saving Daniel.

Ask Questions

Who was Daniel? What did he do to deserve punishment? Did Daniel remain faithful and trust God? What did the king do to Daniel? What did God do?


Name the Truth

Ask Questions

What were the Israelites complaining about? What did God do to give them food?

Name the Truth



Pray for someone who doesn't know Jesus. It can be a friend, family member, or even someone you don't know.

Learn from the Word

Read the appropriate scripture.

Quick Version: Jesus sat down to eat with tax collectors and sinners. This made the teachers of the law angry with Jesus. These people were unclean. The teachers of the law would never have been their friends. But Jesus taught them that God loves them too.

Ask Questions



Name the Truth

God's grace is for all mankind!

Take Action

Jesus died for you and me. He died for our sins. He took the punishment that was meant for us. Have you ever done something wrong, or done something that wasn't very nice? Write those things on a piece of paper. Then take a minute and ask God to forgive you of those sins. After that, throw the paper in the trash! Jesus can take away your sins. By throwing away that piece of paper it represents what God does with your sin. He wipes the slate clean and gives us a new paper (heart). God is full of amazing grace!

Today is a new year. We start over with a fresh slate. As you read in the story, Jesus also had a new beginning. Even though Satan wanted to keep Him in the grave, He rose from the dead!
