On November 6, 1966, fifty-nine people came to the first service for Calvary Church. Most of the people there were simply well-wishers, but about twelve had committed to M.C. and Betty Johnson to help birth a church.

Calvary Temple - as the church was originally named - was determined to set traditions aside and simply look to the Word of God to guide their actions and beliefs. They had a deep desire to minister to people from the *cradle to the grave*. This desire along with the blessing of God inspired them to pursue their calling

A children's ministry started on the second Sunday, and as the church grew, more ministries were added to meet the needs of people of all ages and to give opportunities for people to use their gifts.

Today, Calvary continues to help people discover the *life to the full* that Jesus came to offer by offering ministries that serve people throughout every stage of life. We have nurseries available for infants, programs for kids and students, activities for young adults, and events for senior adults. Other ministries include Calvary Day Care, which serves families with children starting at six weeks old, Calvary Academy, a pre-kindergarten through 12th grade school committed to building dynamic Christian leaders, and Capitol Retirement Village, which provides independent living for senior adults. There are ministries available and places to serve every day of the week.

At Calvary, we are serious about being a New Testament church by loving and serving people in Springfield and around the world. We believe God wants us to learn how to live His way, and that He has created us for good works. These two truths drive us to study God's Word so we can apply it to our lives and be open to being used to help others.

All of this happens because God's Son, Jesus, intervened in this world. As we follow Him, we will find life to the full. This is our vision.

We invite you to join us in discovering this for yourself and helping others find it as well.

Tithe & Offerings

At Calvary, we practice tithing for the support of Christ's Body, the Church, as God commands. We recognize that giving 10% of our income is the biblical standard for giving.

We try to be transparent with our handling of finances at Calvary. Members can meet with our business administrator and ask any questions they'd like regarding how we use the financial resources God has given us. Further, an external auditing firm reviews our financial records and practices on a regular basis to ensure that we manage your tithes and offerings appropriately.

The giving of tithes and offerings is worship to God and an expression of the relationship between the individual giver and the Lord. Tithes and offerings are worship; they are not business transactions but an expression of gratitude toward God.

CALVARY CHURCH STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Bible, both Old and New Testaments, is the foundation of our faith and practice. For this reason, you will find scripture references following each of our fundamental truths.

The Scripture Inspired

The Bible is the inspired Word of God to mankind and is the authoritative rule for our faith and conduct.

The One True God

We believe there is one true God who revealed Himself as the eternal Creator of Heaven and Earth and the Redeemer of mankind. God is revealed to us as a trinity in the persons of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

The Deity of the Lord Jesus Christ

The Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God. He was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, performed many miracles, died on a cross to pay the penalty for man's sins, arose from the grave, and ascended into Heaven where He is exalted at God's side.

The Fall of Man

Man was created by God after the very image of God. However, by his own voluntary actions, man fell out of God's grace and favor. This resulted in not only physical death but also spiritual death, which is separation from God.

The Salvation of Man

Man's only means of regaining a relationship with God is through the shed blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Salvation is received when man turns from his sin (repentance) and turns toward faith in God and Jesus Christ.

The Ordinances of the Church

Baptism in Water

Following the command of New Testament teaching, those who have experienced salvation should be baptized in water. This act is an outward symbol of new spiritual life in Christ.

Holy Communion

Holy Communion, referred to as "The Lord's Supper," consists of bread or wafers and the fruit of the vine. Believers in Christ share communion to remember His death and look forward to His return. It is also an expression of the believers' shared divine nature of Christ.

The Baptism of the Holy Spirit

Believers are encouraged to experience the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, which was the typical experience in the early Christian church. The baptism in the Holy Spirit brings power for life and service, a deeper love for God, a greater dedication to Christ and His work and Word.

The Evidence of Baptism in the Holy Spirit

The initial physical evidence of the baptism in the Holy Spirit is speaking with other tongues as enabled by the Spirit of God.

Sanctification

Sanctification is an active effort on the part of the believer to separate from evil and dedicate oneself to God. The believer identifies with Christ's death and resurrection and daily seeks to surrender himself to the direction of Christ's teaching and the Holy Spirit.

The Church

The Church is considered the Body of Christ. It is where God lives through the Spirit. Each believer is an important part of the Church.

The Bible establishes that ministries will exist within the Church so that those who do not believe in Christianity can be reached and that believers in Jesus Christ can be established in the teachings of the Church.

Healing from sickness has been provided through the shed blood of Jesus Christ.

The Blessed Hope

Christians who have died will one day rise from their graves to meet the Lord in the air. Christians who have not yet died will be caught up with them to be with the Lord. This event is referred to as the Rapture.

The Millennial Reign of Christ

The Second Coming of Christ includes the rapture of believers, followed by the visible return of Christ with His believers to rule on the Earth for one thousand years. The Millennial Reign of Christ will bring salvation to Israel and establish universal peace.

The Final Judgment

There will be a final judgment when those who died without accepting Christ's salvation will be judged for their unbelief and sent to eternal punishment in the lake of fire.
